

We are continuing to focus on the pressing sanitation needs for the families we build for.

This means providing a bathroom beyond what each family presently has. Taking into consideration a water source and area terrain, we continue to explore what a long-term sustainable solution can be. We are presently making this a priority for families as we head into the year ahead.

An update we thought you would enjoy:

We built a home for Carmelina and her son Rogelio in 2022. They were living in a small two room dwelling with a dirt floor, no lock on the door, a thin roof without insulation and together they shared a small bed. Rogelio specifically asked us if he could have his own bed in his own new room. This year when we visited Carmelina, Rogelio proudly took us on a tour of his home and showed us his own room.

Two years ago before we said goodbye to Carmelina she told us we are always welcome and she would cook for us the next time we came. We were greeted with a delicious lunch of fried chicken and slaw washed down with a cold coke. It was simply the best meal ever.

We built Carmelina's home wired for electric and purchased a utility pole to be placed outside her house. It was amazing to see she now has electricity and a small refrigerator in her kitchen.

Leaving a family, this time Rogelio and Carmelina, with a new hope is one reason why we continue to do what we do.
